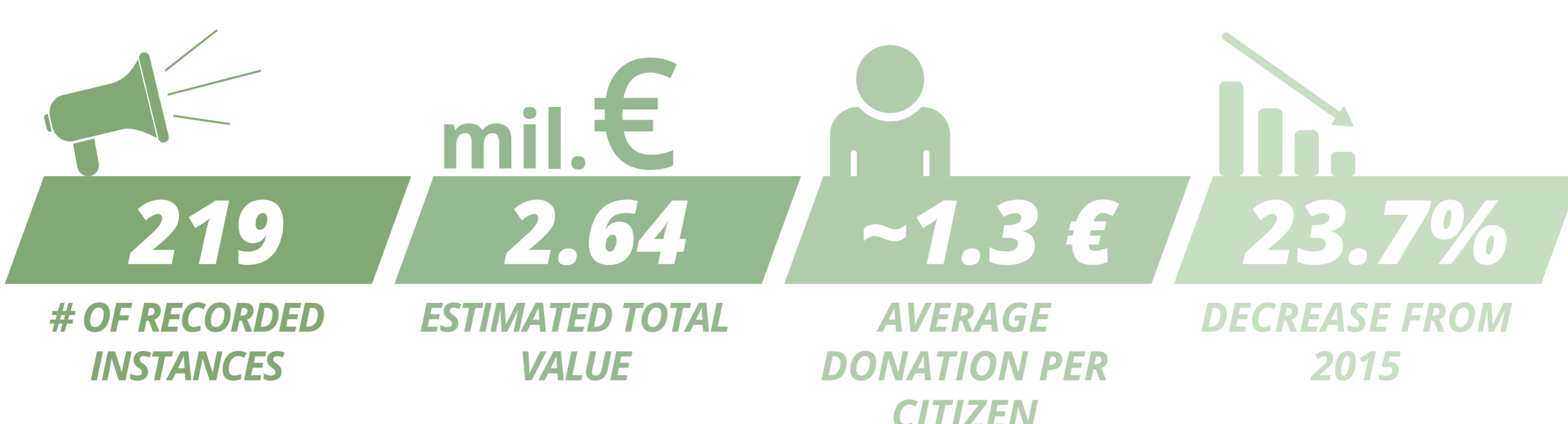

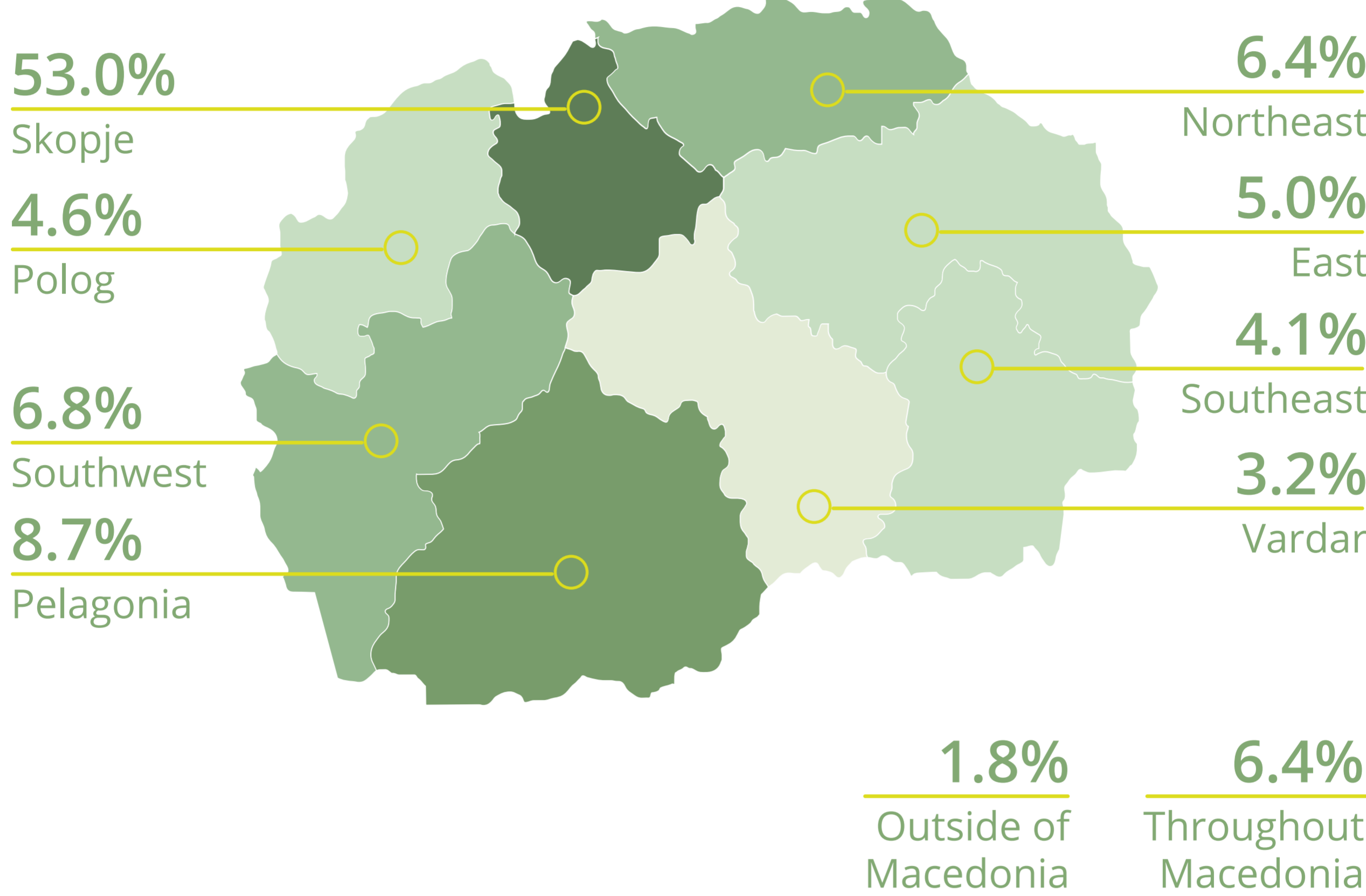

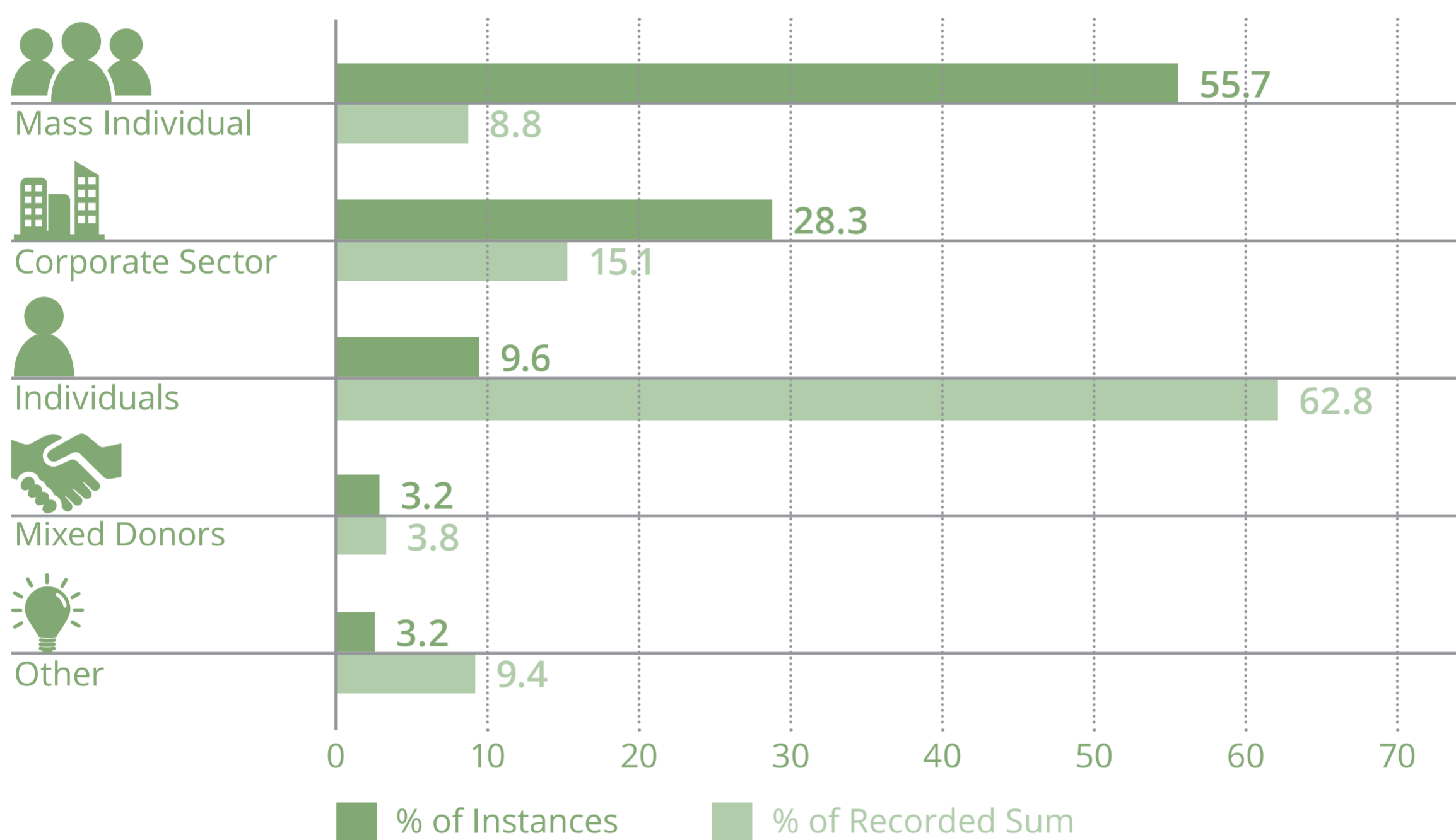
Note: Macedonia was hit by heavy floods during 2016. In order to keep comparability of data, flood donations are excluded.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

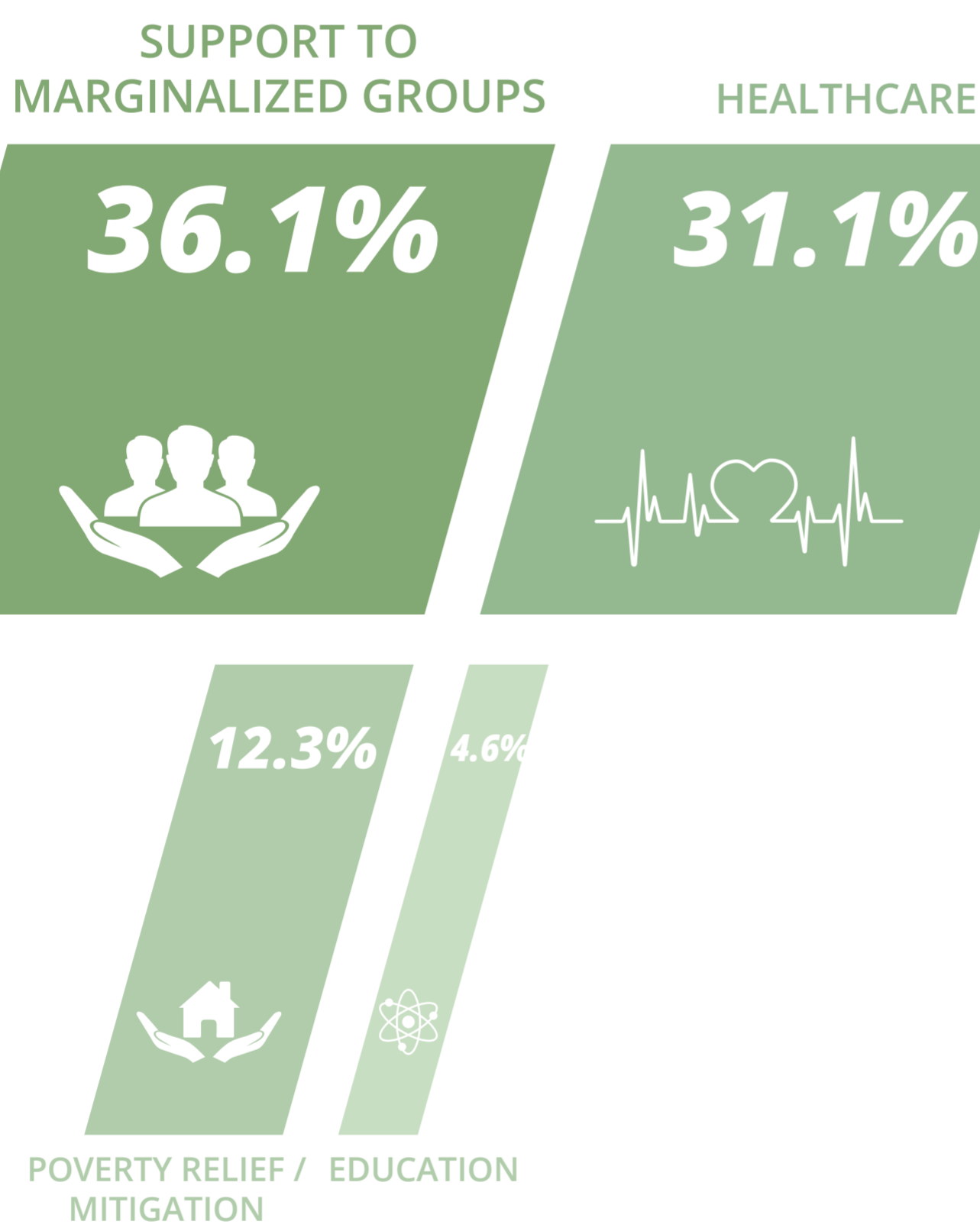

(% of Instances vs. % of Recorded Sum)



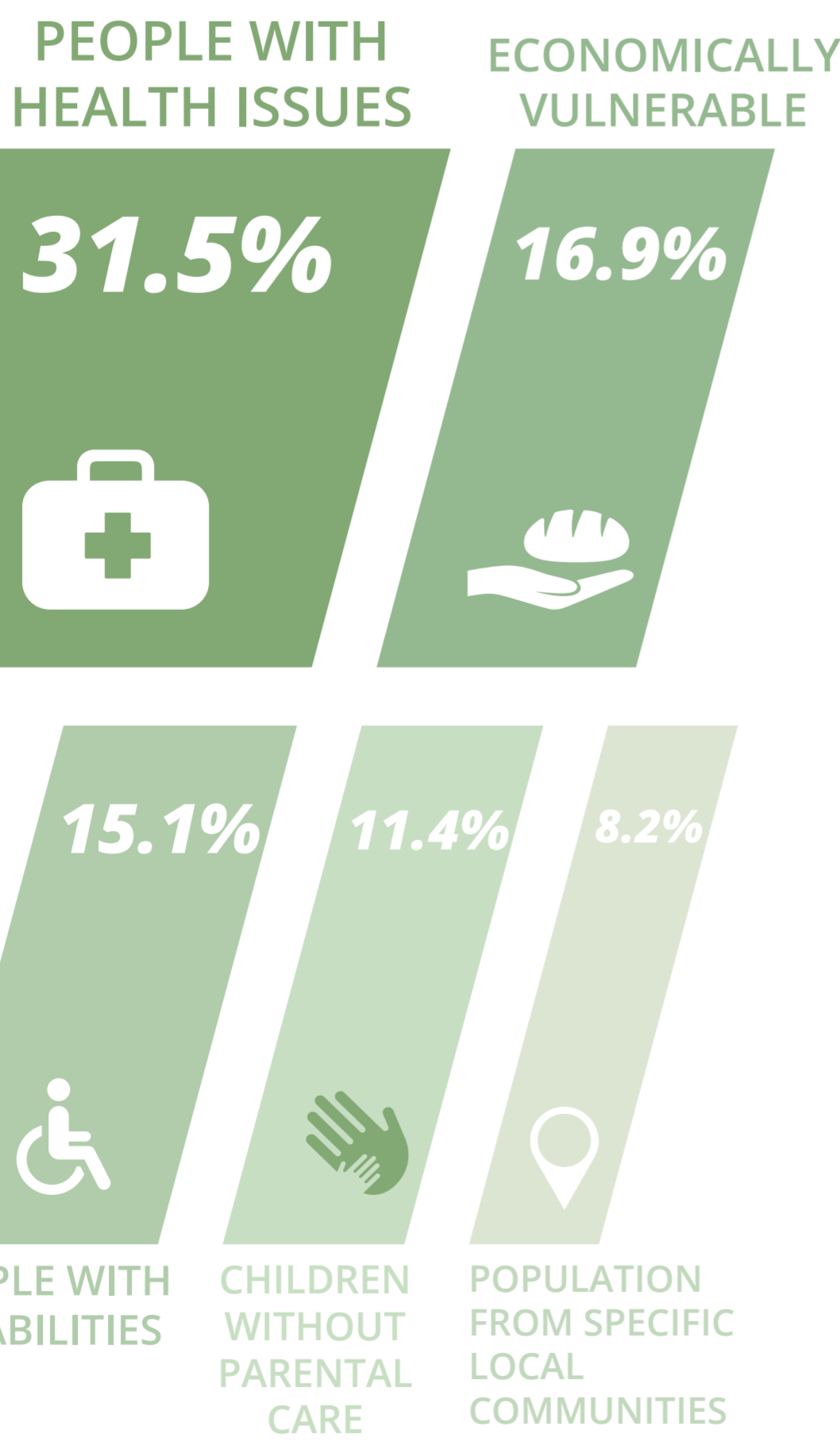

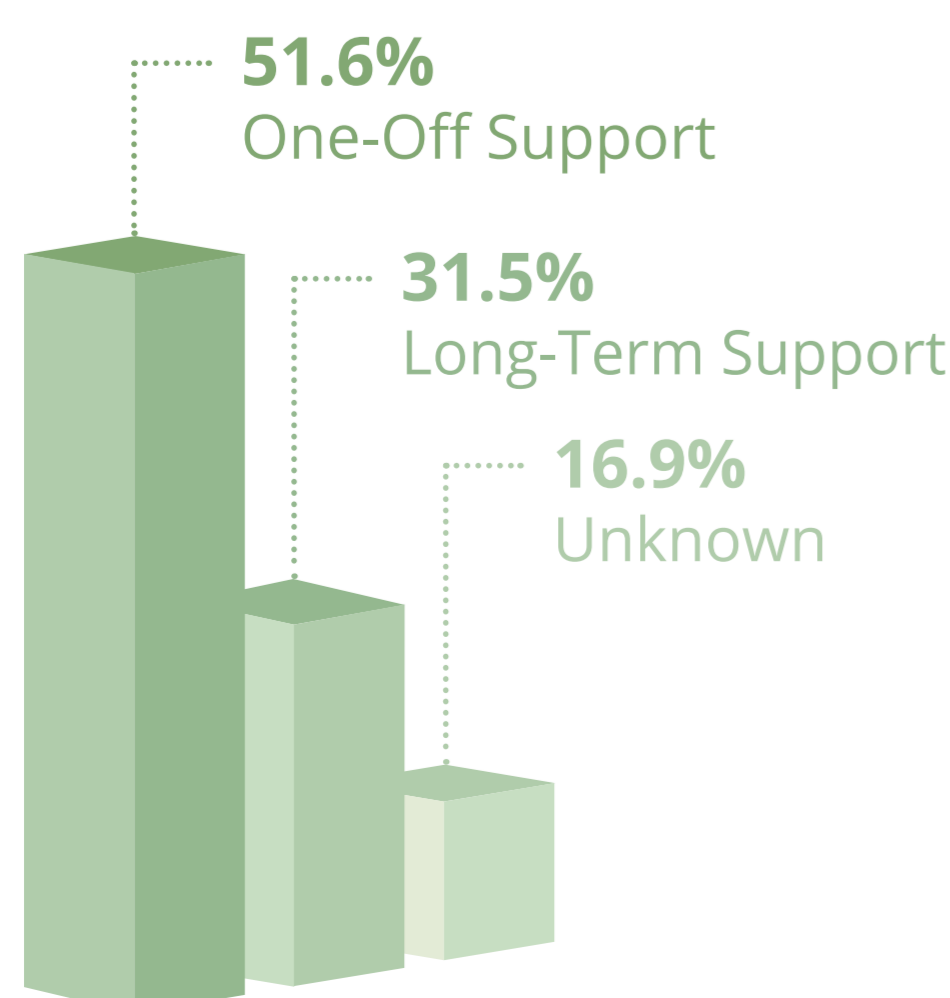
