

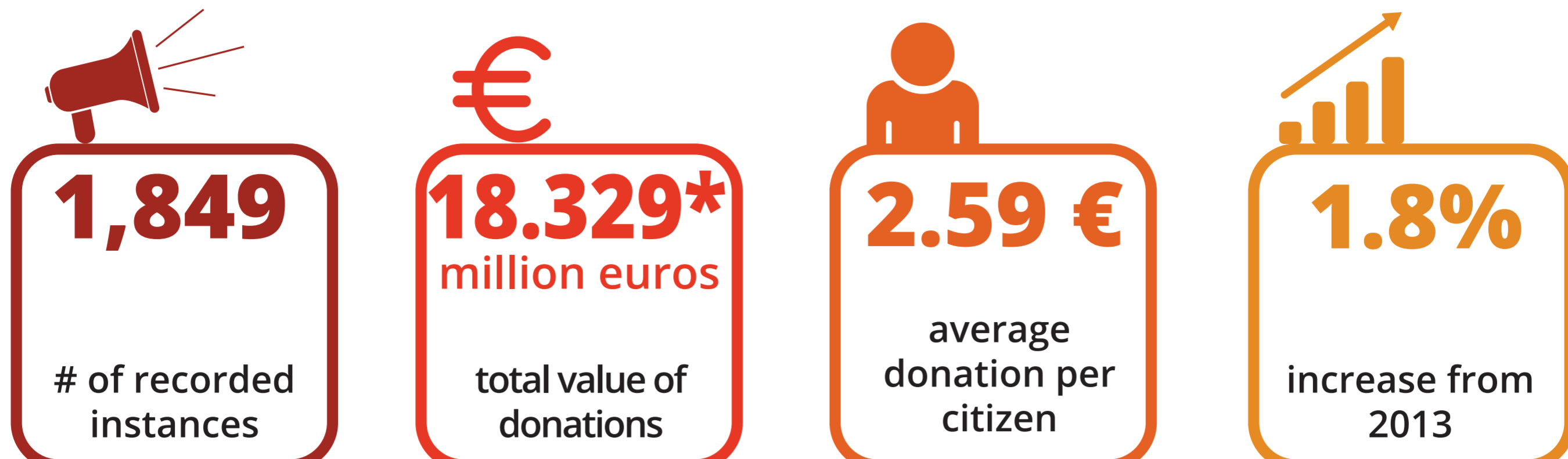

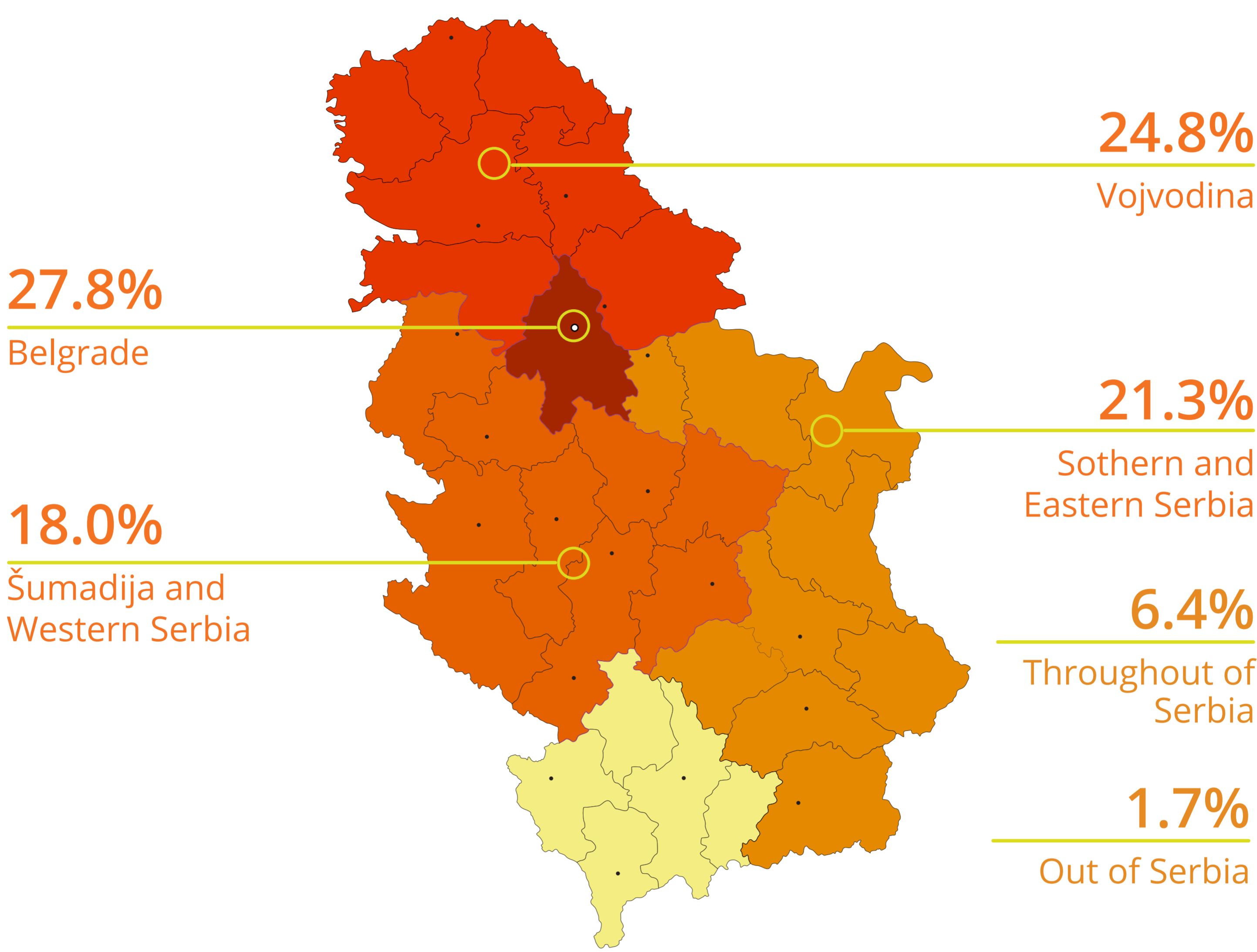

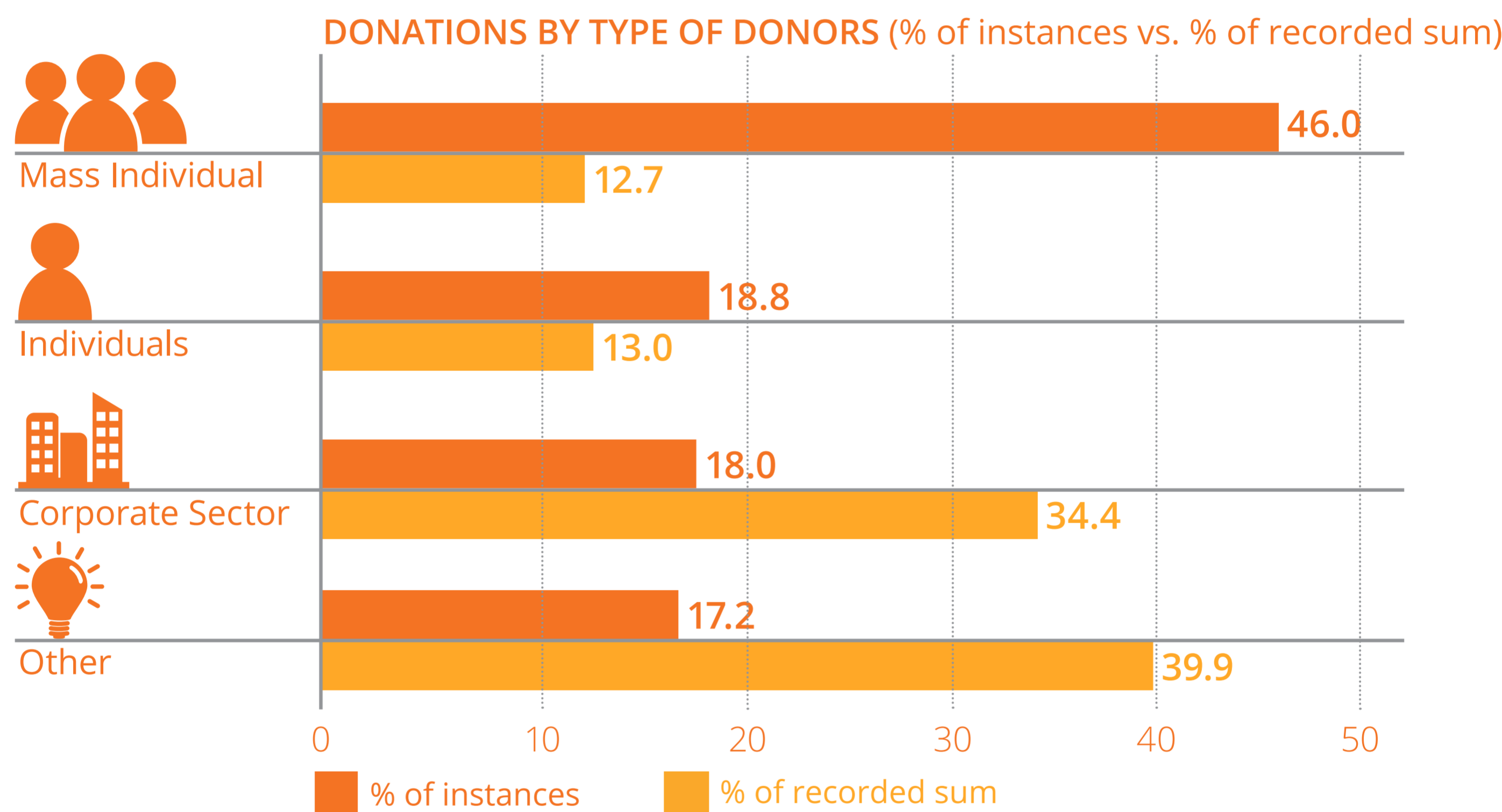

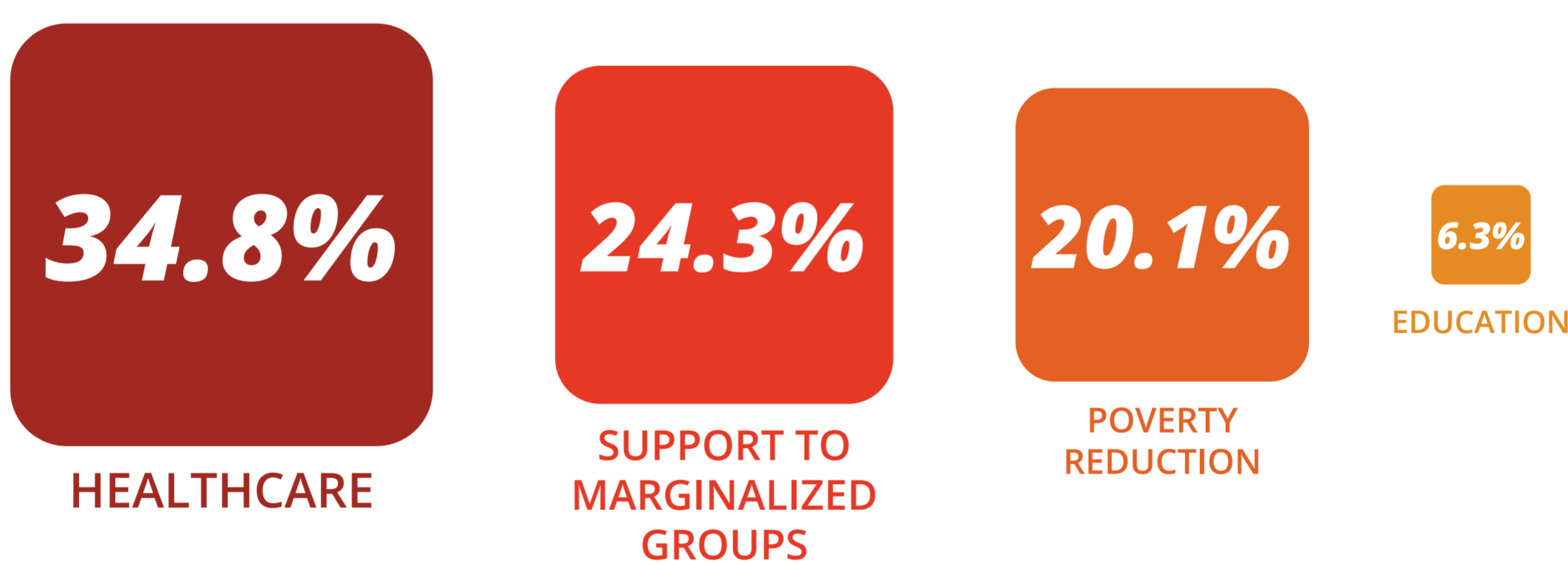
## GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION



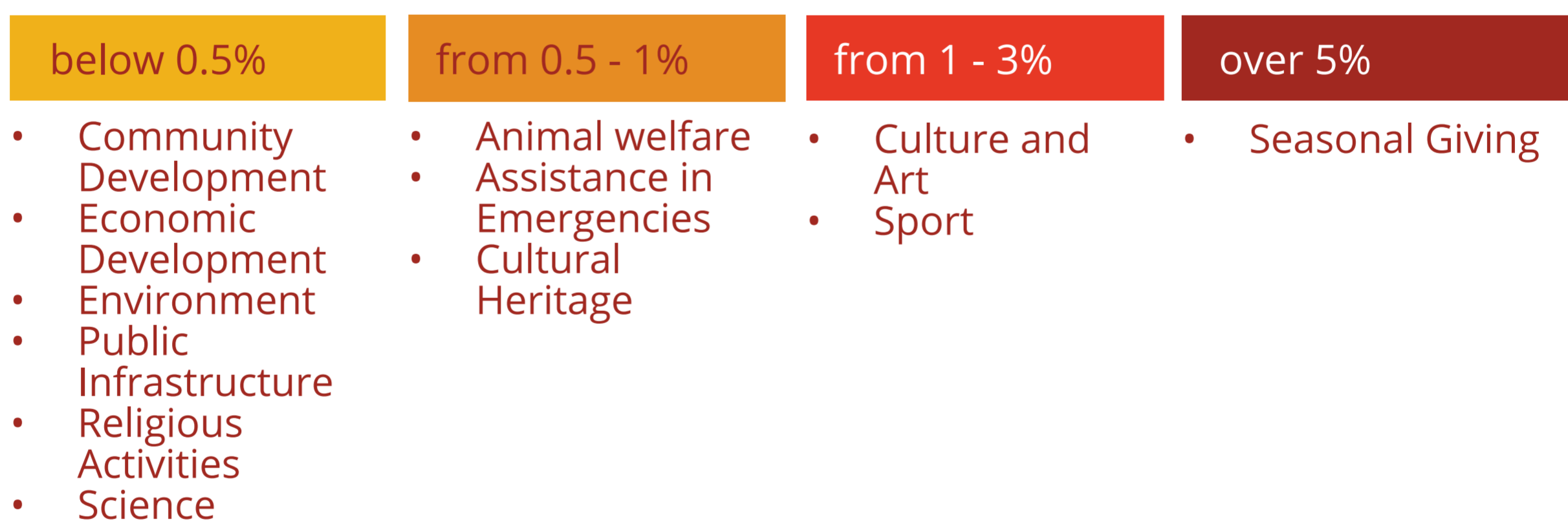

## KEY THEMES FOR GIVING



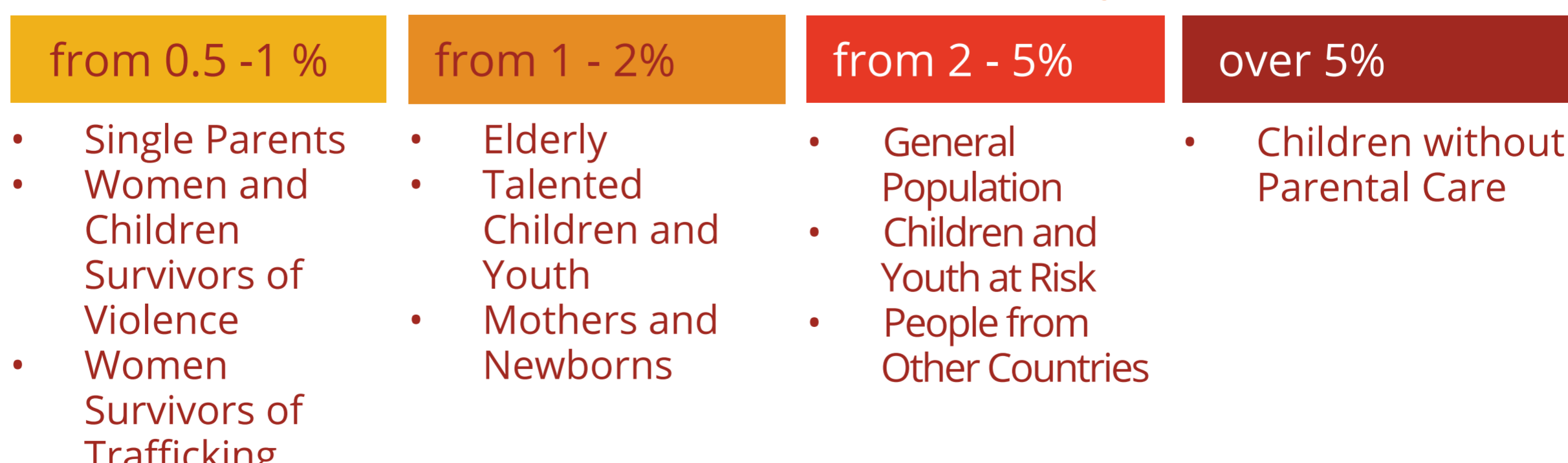
BREAKDOWN OF OTHER THEMES (% of Instances)



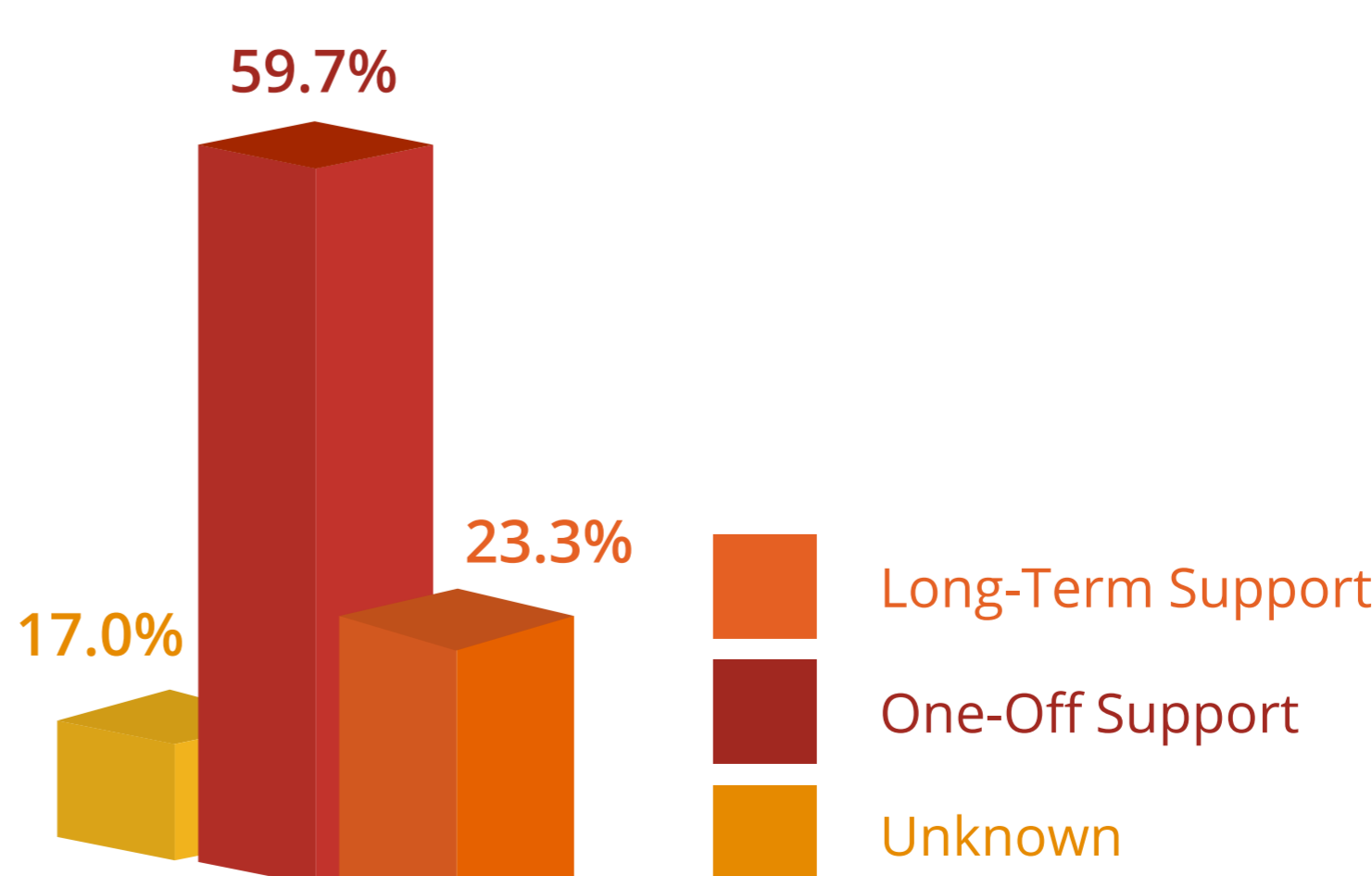
## RECIPIENTS OF DONATIONS
