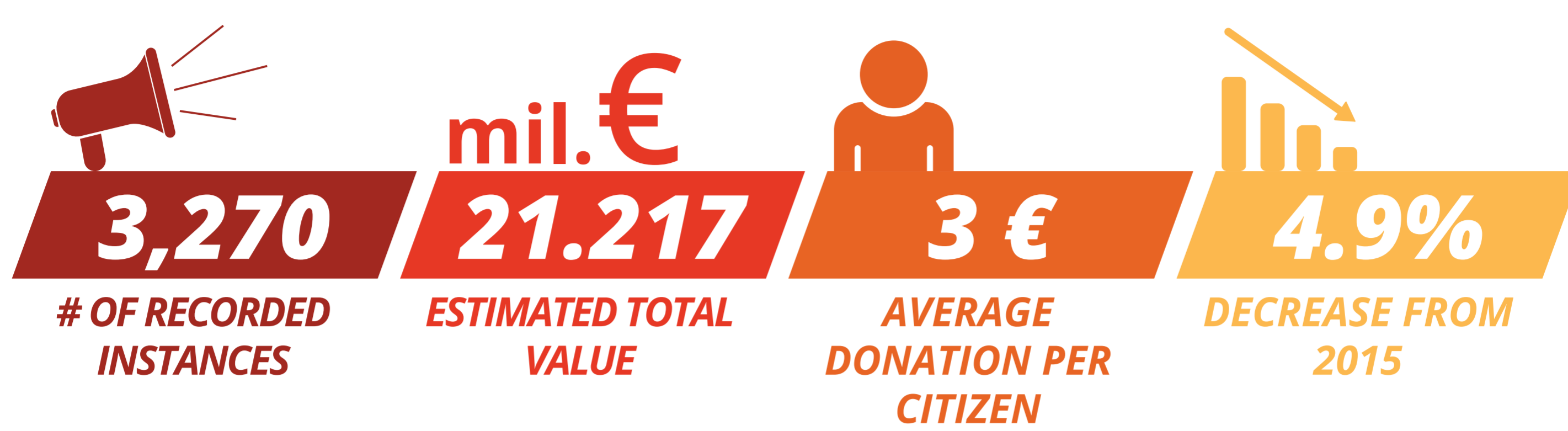

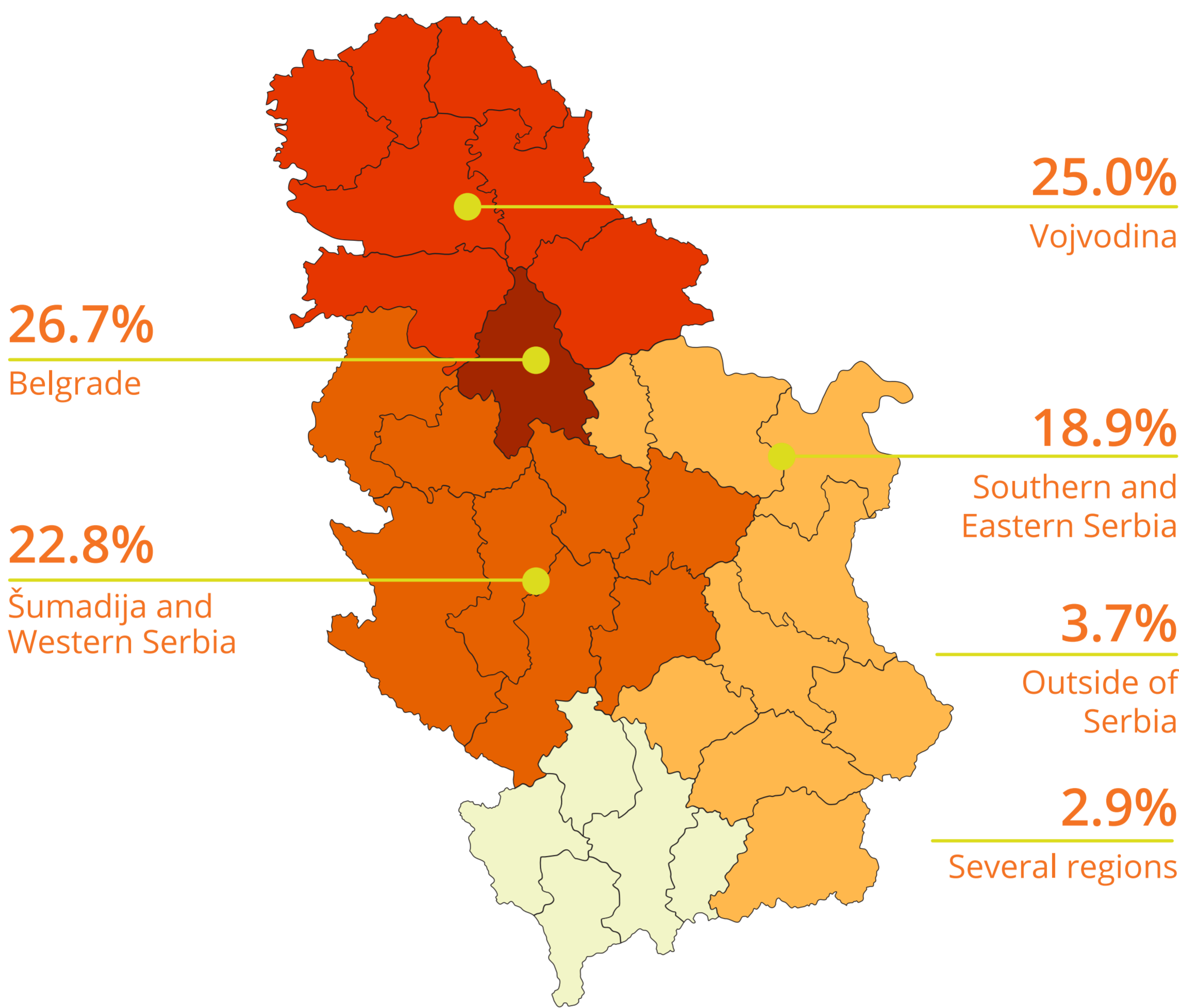

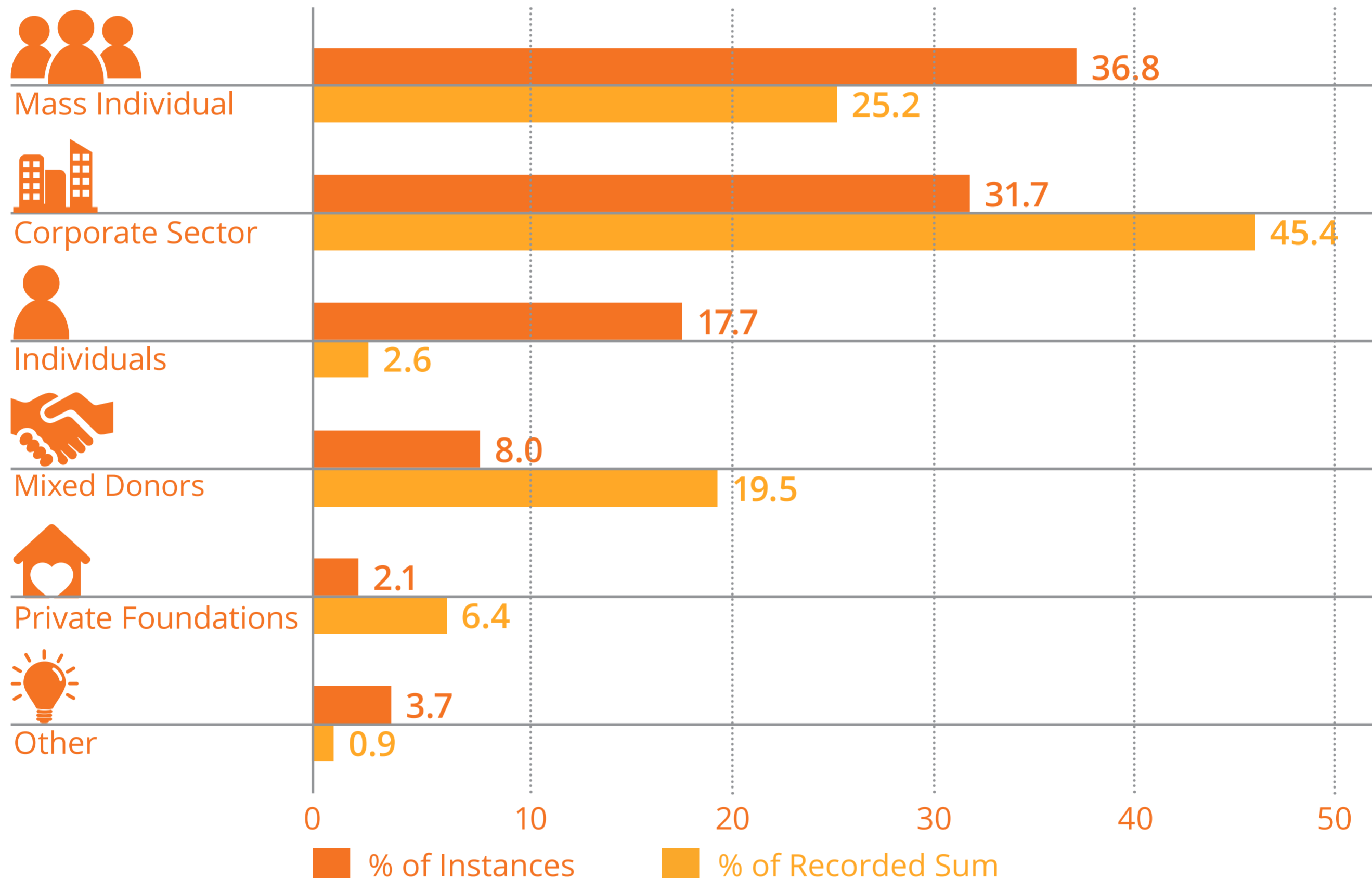

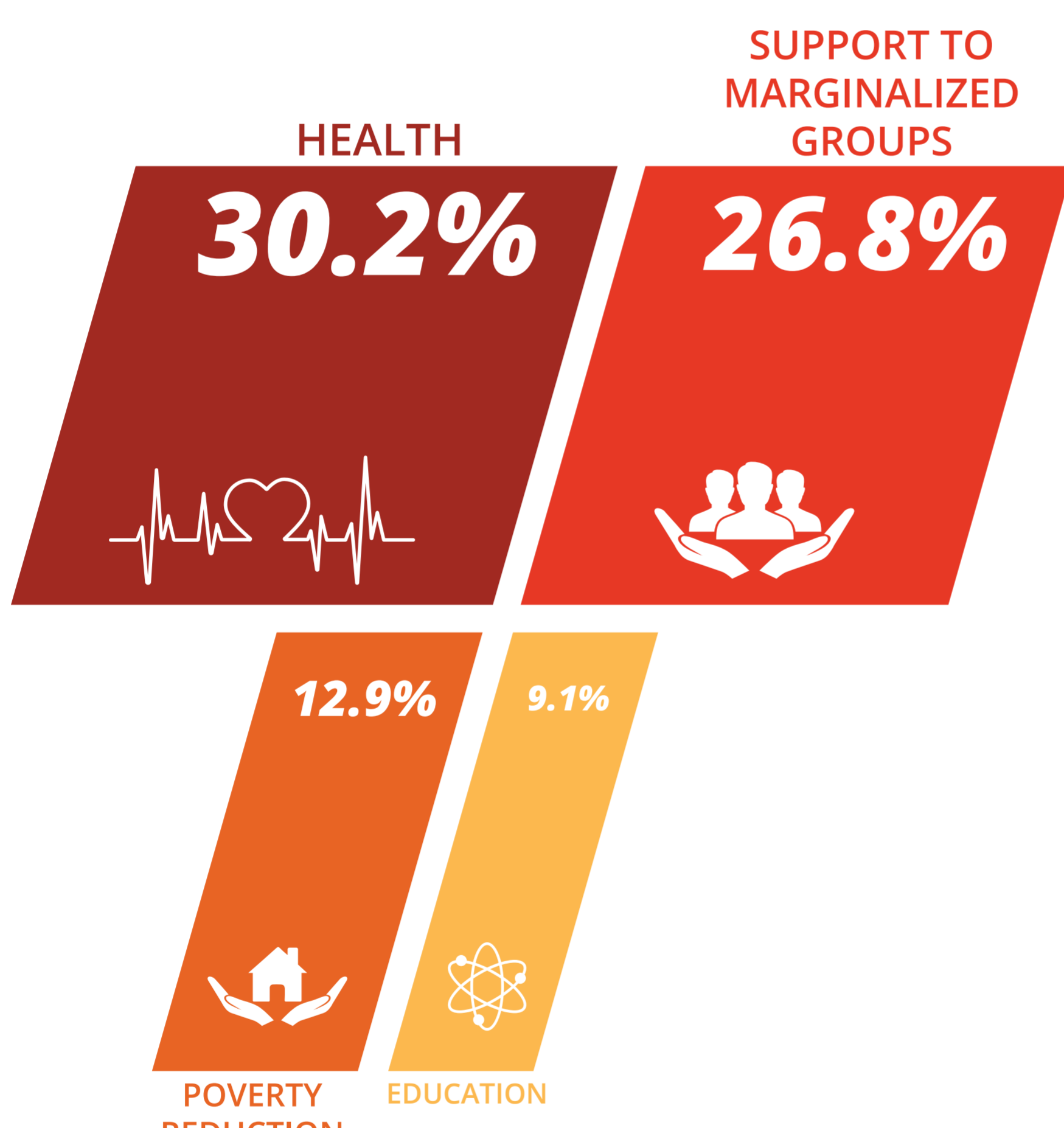
GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

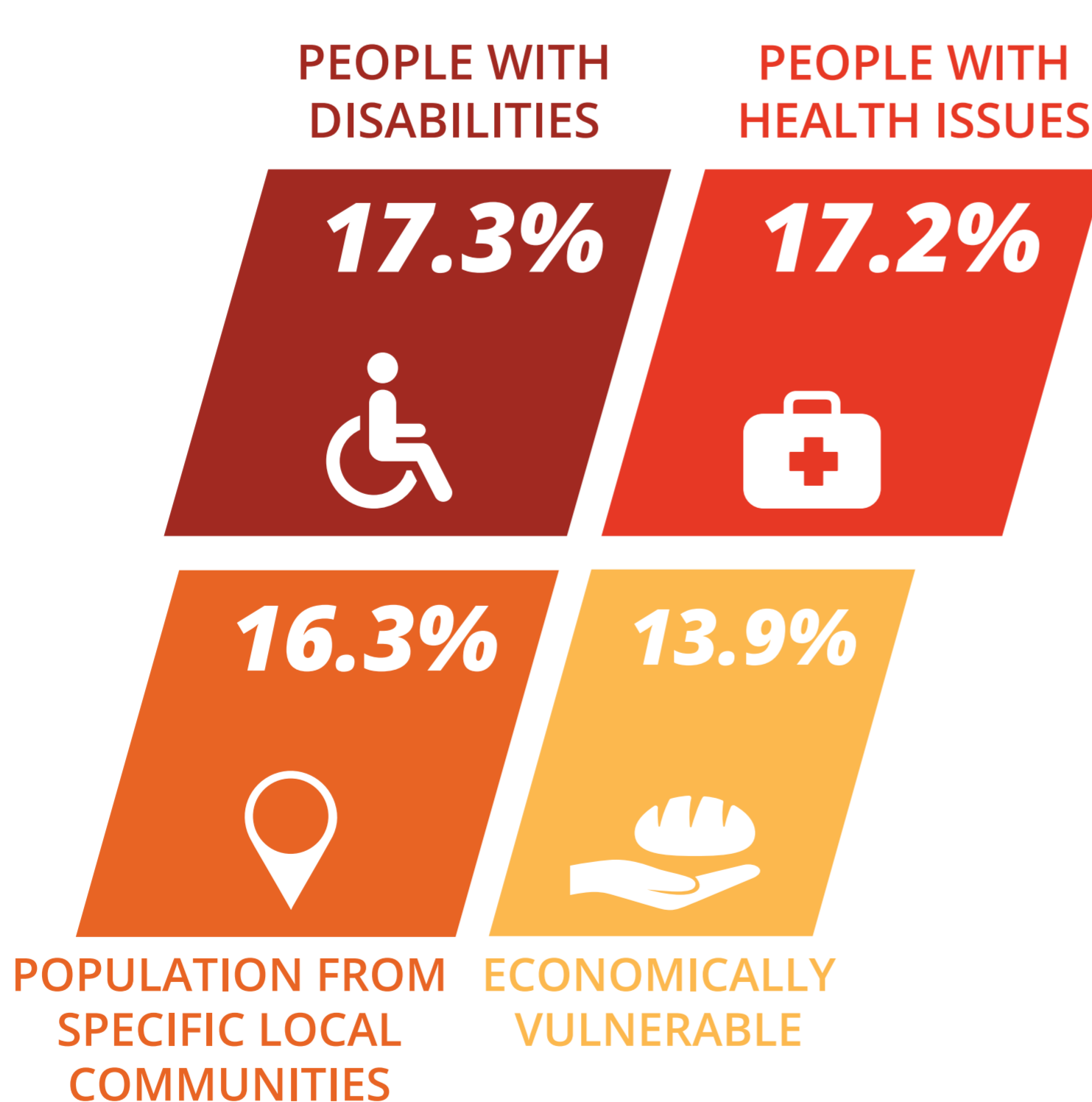

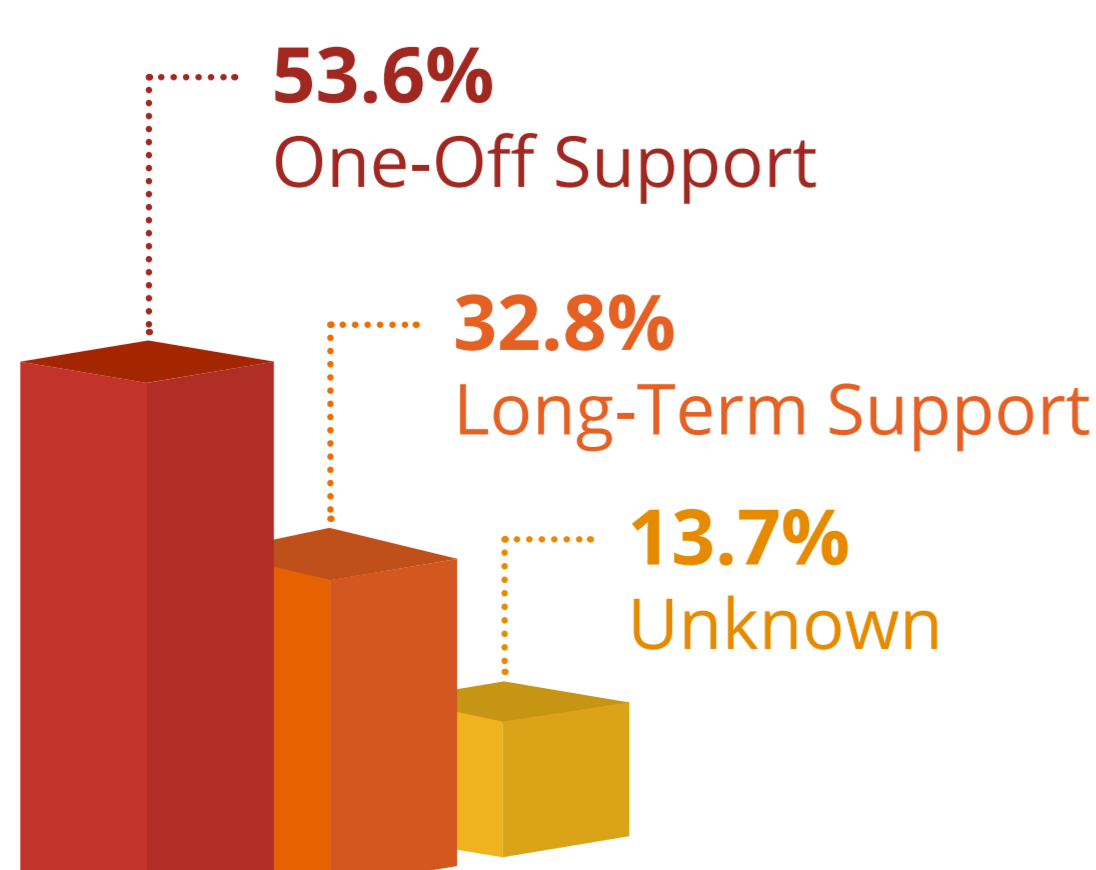
