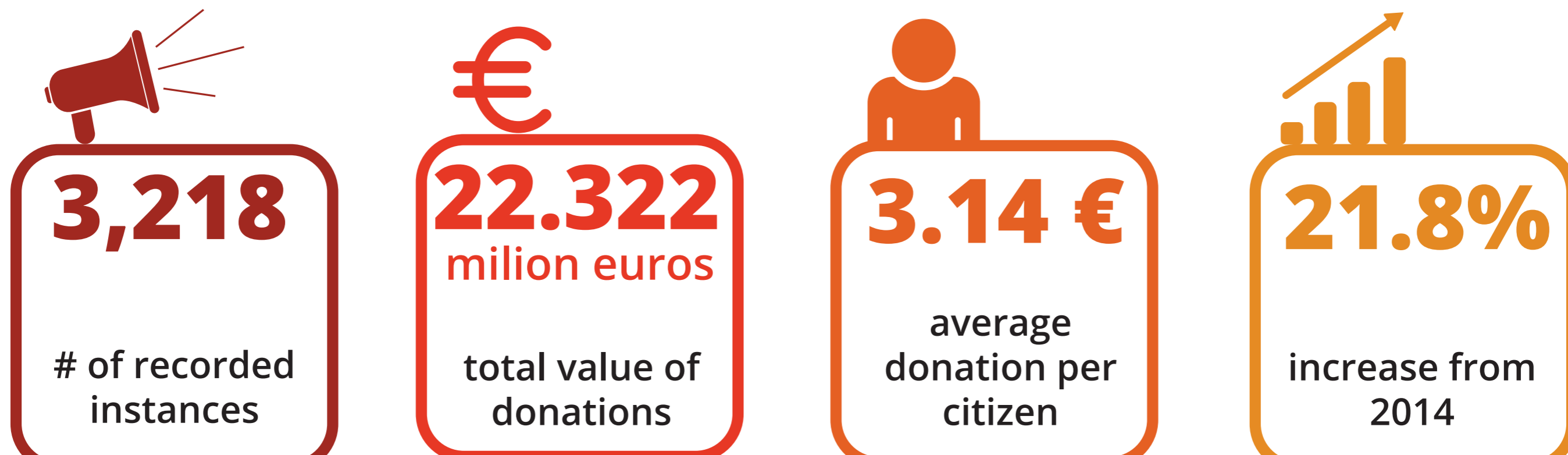

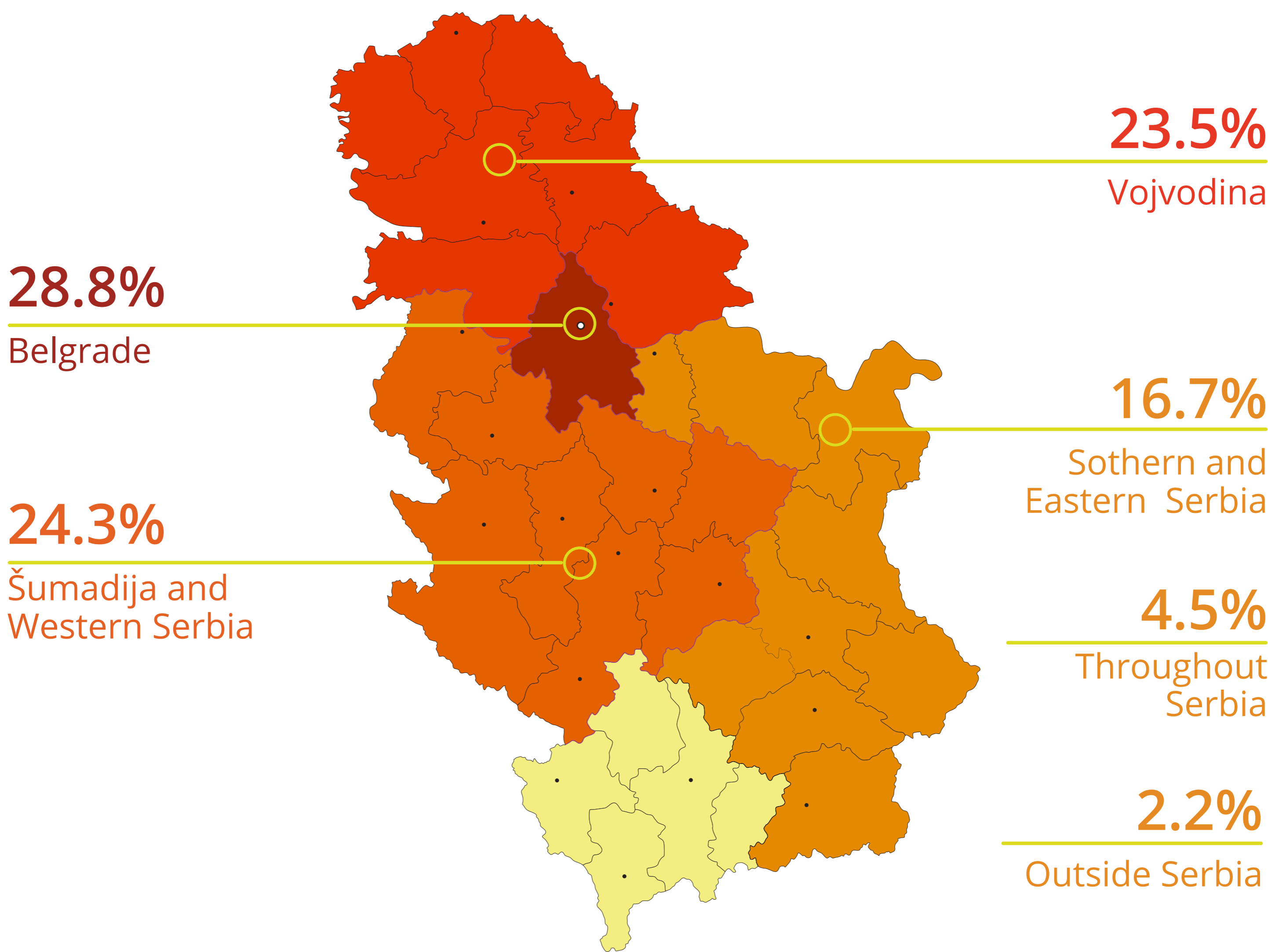

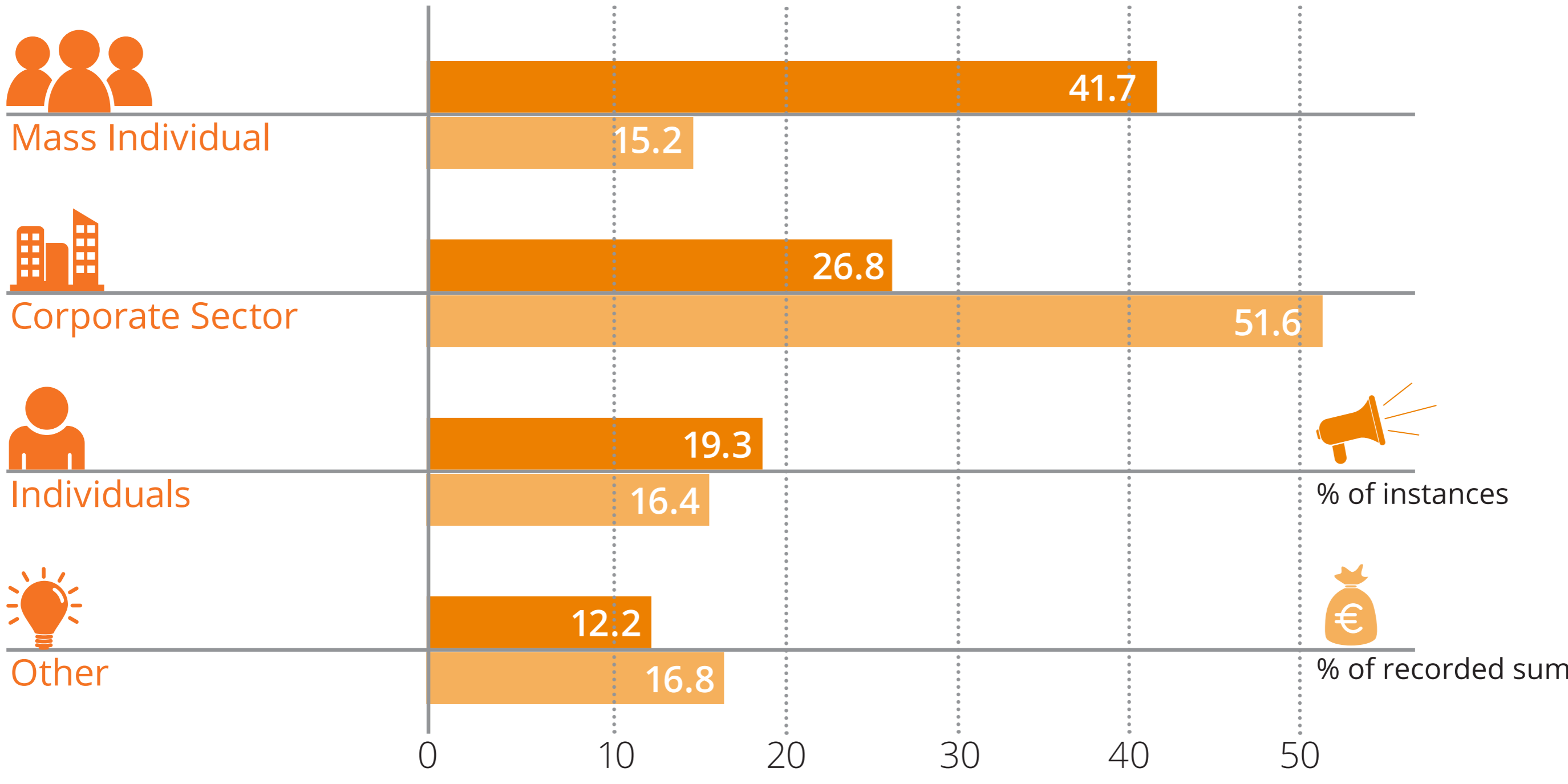


GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

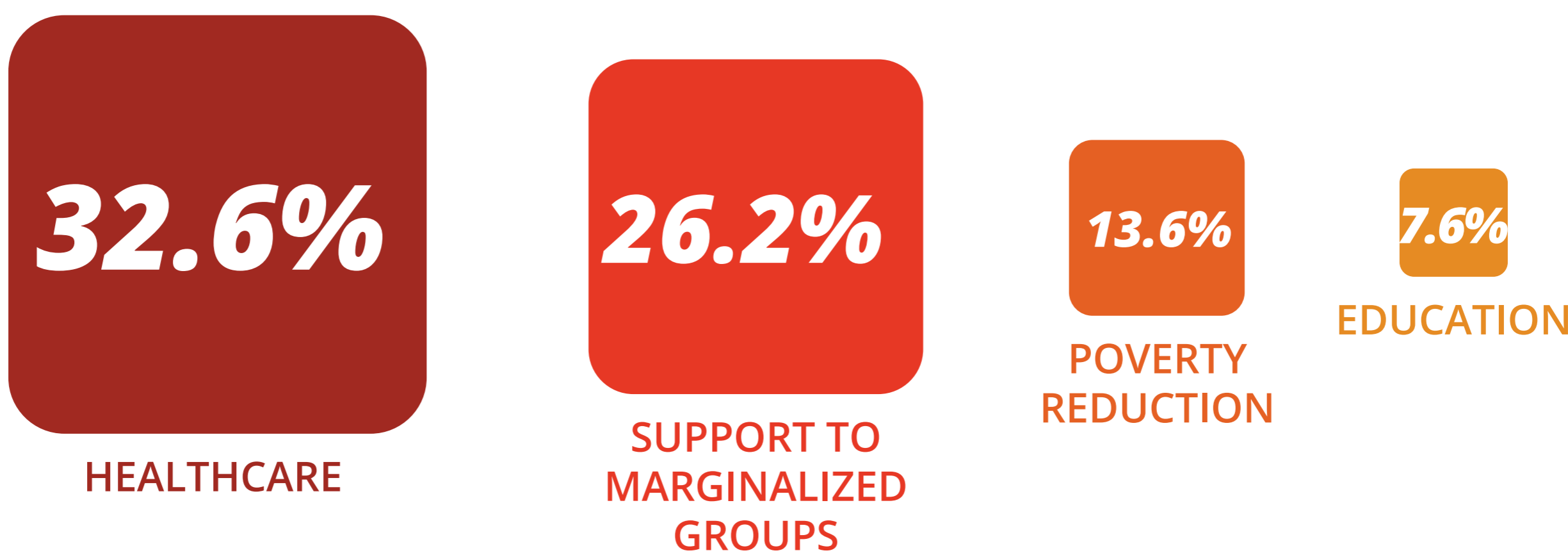

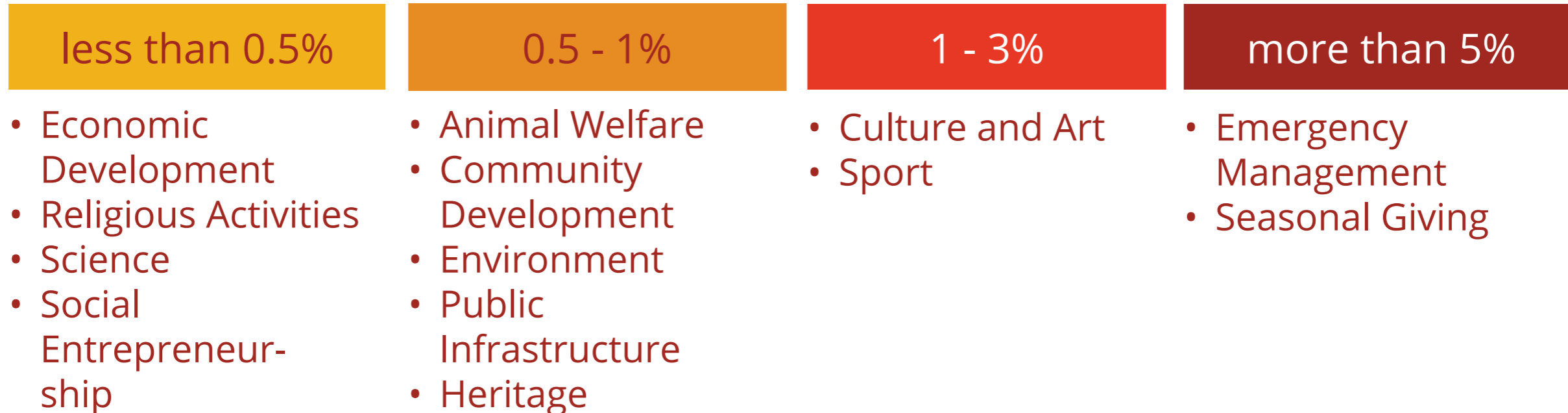
DONATIONS BY TYPE OF DONORS (% of instances vs. % of recorded sum)



KEY THEMES FOR GIVING



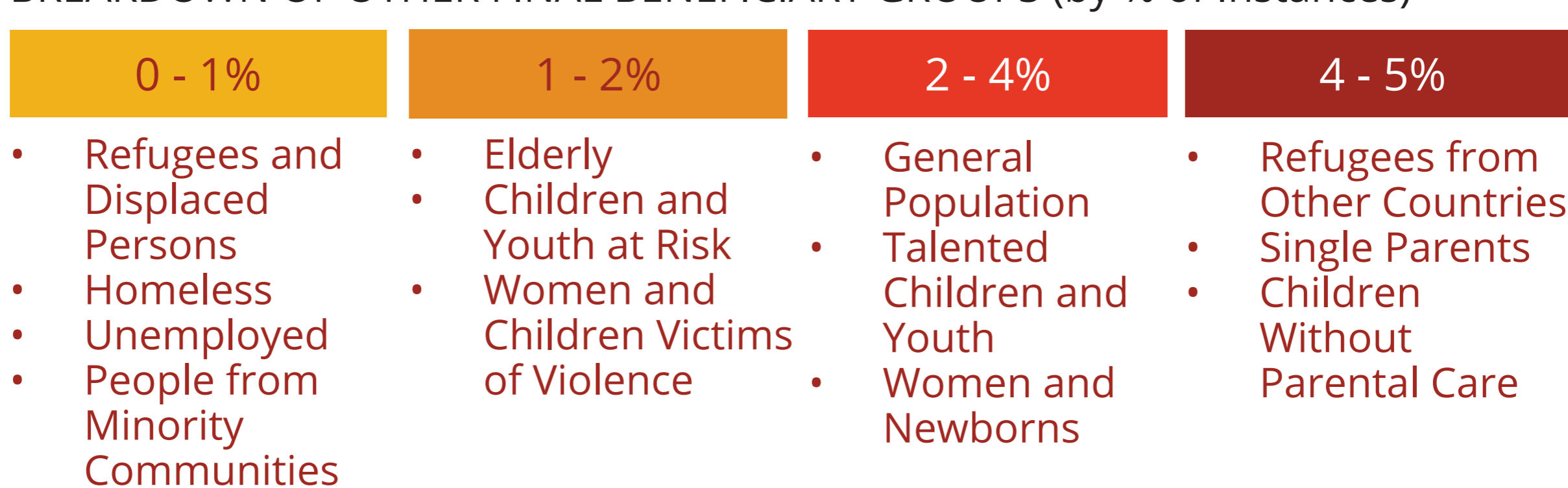
BREAKDOWN OF OTHER THEMES (by % of Instances)



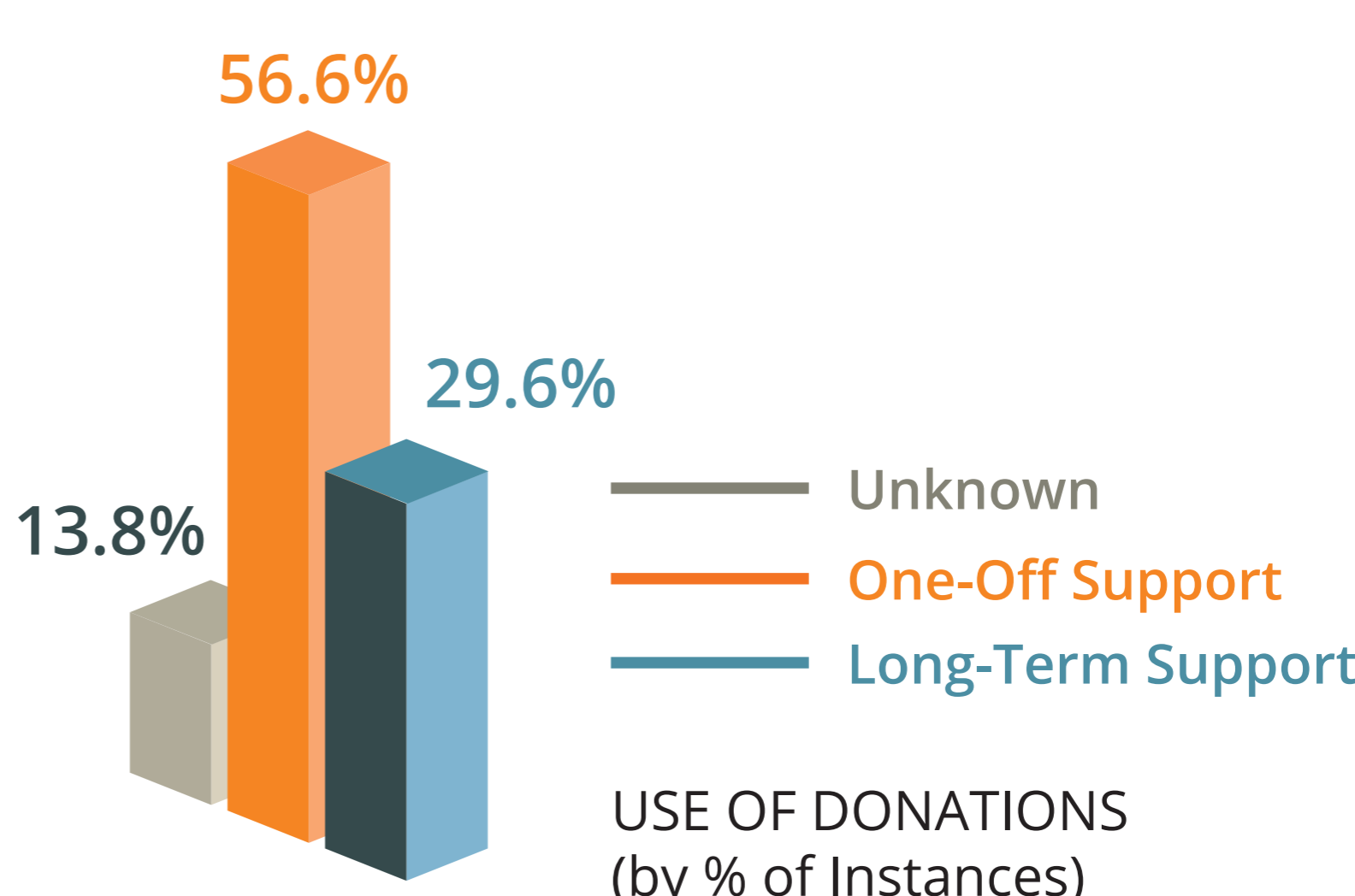
RECIPIENTS OF DONATIONS
